### Nara Palace Site Historical Park points of interest

## The Gateway to Royal Life

### Timeslip back to the Nara Palace of 1,300 years ago

In this space, you can view a 200:1 scale reconstruction of the entire Nara Palace grounds, as well as large-format images and picture scrolls of daily life that bring forth a complete picture of Nara Palace, allowing you to savor the elegance of the ancient Nara.



## Preserving the Legacy of the Nara Palace Site

### Understanding the Nara Period through archeological finds and materials

The continued excavations and research carried out since 1959 has shone light on what Heijokyu and Heijo-kyo really looked like, and helps to introduce visitors to artifacts and materials uncovered from the site in an easy-to-understand manner.

### Here lies the Heisei Mokkan wooden time capsule

The Heisei Mokkan is a time capsule containing messages for people living 1,300 years in the future. 11,400 Nara citizens contributed to the capsule on the 1,300th anniversary of Nara becoming the capital. The wooden capsule was first temporarily buried, then properly buried to coincide with the opening of the Heijokyu Izanai-kan (Guidance Center).

### Please notice the width of the lobby

The width of the Heijokyu Izanai-kan lobby is part of the excavation display, as it is in the exact position, and of the same width as the roads between tsubo (a road system used during the Nara Period).

## A Day in the Life of the Nara Palace Site

### Experience the skills of the craftsmen and the work of the officials of Nara Palace

Here, while viewing a 5:1 scale model of the Daichiji Daigokuden (Former Imperial Audience Hall) up-close that was manufactured as part of its reconstruction you can experience first-hand a variety of crafts from the time, such as the creation of kumimono (wooden support blocks), clay tile roofing, and documents that were written on mokkan (wooden tablets).

Closed on: Second Monday (closed on the day after if a holiday) in Feb., Apr., Jul., and Nov., and between December 29 and January 1

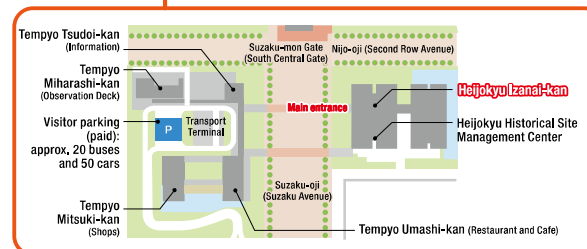
Admission: Free

## Access



- 20 minutes walk from the South Exit of Yamato-Saidaiji Station
- 20 minutes walk from Shin-Omiya Station
- Gurutto Bus Omiya-dori (Omiya Avenue) Route (every 30 minutes on weekdays and every 15 minutes on weekends and public holidays)
  - From Kintetsu Nara Station Bus boarding point 8 to "B18 Suzakumon Hiroba-mae" and 2 minutes walk.
  - From Kintetsu Yamato-Saidaiji Station South Exit Square to "B1 Suzakumon Hiroba" and 1 minute walk.
- From JR Nara Station West Exit Bus boarding point 13, take a bus #160 or #161 to "Suzakuron Hiroba-mae" and 2 minutes walk.
